Survey Result - Highlights

Impact on Relationship with Neighbours

- 70 % of Survey respondents agreed that the program helped them be more engaged in their neighbourhood.

- 37% reported increases in the number of neighbours they would ask to watch their homes while away.

Impact on Views of Police

- 80% greatly or completely trusted the police currently

Impact on Home Security

* 19% of survey respondents reported that being part of their Watch caused them to make security improvements to their home

Impact on Reporting Crime

* 75% of respondents reported a crime to police in the last year

* 62% reported a crime to their neighbours

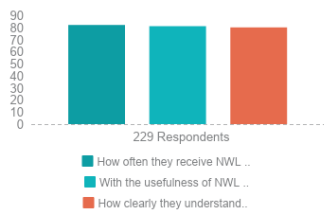
- * A participatory process with seniors: Working together to address social connectedness, engagement and safety Partnering with University of Western Ontario and Meals on Wheels
